College Requirements

1. A total of 60 hours or more must be completed in courses numbered 100 and above as specified in the

curriculum. This total cannot include any courses with ABE, ASE, AMT, ARW, ECO, or ESL prefixes.

- 2. A minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0 for all courses that are applied to the degree.
- 3. Meet the college's Academic Residency Requirement for Associate of Applied Science degrees: A minimum of 15 semester hours of coursework that are degree requirements, six of which must also be disciplinespecific, in courses numbered 100 and above and must have been achieved at ECC, excluding AP, CLEP, and proficiency credits.
- 4. Students may apply up to six hours of Independent Study credit toward any associate degree.
